In addition to that it is possible that two of the Officers may also be new, leaving only two Committee members to offer any form of continuity.</p> <p>We believe it takes new BRS C Committee members a year to find their feet and to become familiar with the way the Committee works. By their second year they are in a much better position to contribute fully to the work of the Committee.</p> <p>Increasing the number of ordinary Committee members to six, and instigating a two year cycle, would allow three Committee members to remain annually, along with the two Officers not due for re-election, hence giving greater continuity.</p> <p>Each year two Officers and three Committee members would be re-elected.</p>
